





- ISPs (At home and mobile)
- Open DNS (All devices at home)
- Google "Family Link" App (Free, mobile devices)
- IOS (Free, iOS devices)
- Microsoft Family Safety
- "Our Pact" App (Monthly Subscription, all devices)

- All the big ISP's have internet filtering tools in place.
- You will be able to turn on a general ISP filter which will block most unsuitable traffic.
- No filter is 100%
- There will be a level of customization on what you can block
- There are ways to circumvent the filtering, most common is a VPN.
- A mobile network is classed as an ISP too, and you can turn on the same filtering through them.
- Innocent sites can also sometimes be blocked so be aware of that.




#### What is OpenDNS?



# Mobile Device Managers

- Manage the Screen time on your family devices
- Manage how long users can spend on individual apps
- View their location
- Block certain apps, and control which apps can be used/installed.
- Many choices out there
- Some are easier to set up than others
- Some are free, some have a subscription cost.
- No one size fits all solution unfortunately.
- Here are a few...




### **Device Control**

- Multiple ways to control devices
- Not every tool may be suitable for your family
- Depends on the devices you use and how you use them






- Best Solution for Android based devices
- Also works with iOS devices but doesn't have the same level of control on iOS
- Uses a Parent App installed on the parents device, and a child app on the childrens device.
- You can remotely control their device from yours.
- Can't block websites completely on the device...
- Uses google's filtering tech to block bad search terms/youtube videos, and mature content on chrome.
- Can monitor location.

### ScreenTime iOS



- Only works with Apple(iOS) devices
- Simple setup on the childs device with a passcode, no software setup needed.
- Best for setting limits on usage.
- Can block websites apple deem unsuitable, by age group.
- Can't fully track a childrens location unless they share it with you.
- No monitoring ability.

- This will control Windows devices, xbox's, and some limited functionality on android.
- Best option for windows and Android users.
- Will work with Windows 10+, Xbox One or newer.
- Screen time functionality works on Windows, Xbox and Android.
- Track Websites, and block using content filters.
- Control spending on their xbox/microsoft account.
- Uses google's filtering tech to block bad search terms/youtube videos, and mature content on chrome.
- Only filters content on Edge browser.
- Can monitor location, if you have a personal Office 365 subscription

### Microsoft Family Safety





- Best Solution for multi device Households
- Works well with Apple and Android devices
- More involved setup, needing a PC/MAC computer, and USB cables to sync to each device, and will need a number of settings changing on the devices you monitor.
- Extremely comprehensive solution
- Web filtering is limited compared with other solutions.
- Does come with a monthly subscription cost, although Free trial available.
- Would need to be fairly comfortable with tech to install this solution.






- 1. Sign in to your account.
- 2. On the top right, tap More 🚦 .
- 3. Select Settings > General.
- 4. Turn Restricted Mode on or off.



- 1. Go to Google search engine
- 2. Click on 'Settings
- 3. Then 'Search settings'
- Then, click 'Turn on SafeSearch' to filter explicit results – this will help avoid most adult content

### **Family Agreement**

A practical tool to start discussions about how to behave online and set clear expectations for your family.

A family agreement is a great way to start a conversation with your whole family about how you all use the internet, and to start discussions together around how to behave in a positive way when online, whether this is at home, at school or at a friend's.

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### Online safety agreement

The internet is a very important part of our lives today and setting up an agreement can help ensure that everyone within your organisation/ group are safe when navigating the online world. It gives you the opportunity to discuss together how to behave in a positive way and what to do when things go wrong. Bear in mind it is difficult to have complete control over anyone's internet usage, however an online safety agreement is a great way to set clear expectations for positive and safe internet use.

Please note this agreement is to support your organisation in working to keep young people safe online and should never be used in place of a safeguarding policy or acceptable use policy.


### Arbor – Is a data management area for staff, students and parents

- For students Arbor allows you to:
  - See your Timetable
  - See your Attendance
  - Manage the recording of your Home Learning

You should log into this now to view your timetable. You should also submit any home learning tasks that have been put on there from the past few weeks.

- A link to Arbor should have appeared on your iPad (if not use the internet and search 'Arbor login')
- Click 'Forgot your password'
- Enter your school email address
- Check the email that is in your school inbox and reset your Password to something you will remember
- Log in to Arbor and view your information





**HOME LEARNING** – this year the management of HL will be done on Arbor (you will complete the HL somewhere else, eg: in your exercise book, or on OneNote/Showbie/Teams). When you view your area on Arbor it will show you (and parents if they look on their log-in area) what your outstanding HL is, when it is due, which work you have submitted, etc...
