1216-1272	King Henry III (son of John)
1272-1307	King Edward I (son of Henry III)
1307-1327	King Edward II (son of Edward I)
1327-1377	King Edward III (son of Edward II)
1377-1399	King Richard II (grandson of Edward III, son of the Black Prince)
1399-1413	King Henry IV (grandson of Edward III, son of John of Gaunt)
1413-1422	King Henry V (son of Henry IV)
1422-1461	King Henry VI (son of Henry V)
1461-1483	King Edward IV (youngest son of Edward III)
1483-1485	King Richard III (uncle of Edward V, one of the tragic Princes in the Tower)

Key Events

1347 The Black Death reaches Europe from Asia

1348 The Black Death reaches England

1349 Nearly 30% of the population are killed by the Black Death

1381 The Peasants' Revolt

Symptoms a sign or indication of something - in this case a sign that you had been infected with the Black Death	Plague an disease that causes high death rate and spreads very quickly	Infectious Meaning that the disease would spread very quickly from one person to the next and across the whole world	Consequence the effect, result, or outcome of an event	Remedy/Cure something that cures or relieves a disease or bodily disorder; a healing medicine, application, or treatment	Apothecary The equivalent of a pharmacy in medieval times that people would visit to buy cures
Peasants Lower class of people who were small farmers or farm labourers of low social rank.	Feudal System This system was a way of dividing up the land in England to give William control across the entire country.	Revolt/Revolution An uprising where people want to overthrow the ruling classes	Social Issues that effect the day to day life of people	Psychological Issues that relate to ideas and beliefs of people	Economic Issues that relate to money

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
