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Sixth Form Entry Policy

Each applicant is considered individually on their own personal merits but broadly:

Good at exams = subjects assessed mainly on exams – academic A-levels

Prefer coursework = subjects that have a higher percentage of coursework to exam – vocational subjects and some A-levels





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Sixth Form Entry Policy

Basic requirements for courses with a large coursework element:

At least four GCSE passes at grade 4 or above, preferably including Maths and English, although resits in these subjects are possible.







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Sixth Form Entry Policy

General entry requirements for A-level courses:

An average GCSE grade of 4 **plus** the subject entry requirements for each course (these can be found on each subject information sheet)







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Support for next steps

Professional academic pathway – medics, vets and dentists

Oxbridge academic pathway – high achievers at GCSE

Sports professional pathway – through the Elite Sport and Education programme (ESEP)

Professional vocational pathway – students looking to move straight into apprenticeships or employment

Open options pathway – students looking at Higher Education or Degree apprenticeships
