


- Two aspects to consider:

- YouTube/Google etc






# CONTENT KEEPER (School Filtering System for School iPads)

- In School Filters all devices regardless.
- Out of School Filters all devices singed into Company Portal(regardless of being in the scheme or not)
- Opt In/Out of advanced filtering What does it filter?
- Application control What is filtered?


# ISP's – Internet Service Providers (e.g. BT / Sky / Virgin Media etc...)



- All the big ISP's have internet filtering tools in place.
- You will be able to turn on a general ISP filter which will block most unsuitable traffic.
- No filter is 100%
- There will be a level of customization on what you can block
- There are ways to circumvent the filtering, most common is a VPN.
- A mobile network is classed as an ISP too, and you can turn on the same filtering through them.
- Innocent sites can also sometimes be blocked so be aware of that.


### Mobile Device Managers – Personal Devices

- Manage the Screen time on your family devices
- Manage how long users can spend on individual apps
- View their location
- Block certain apps, and control which apps can be used/installed.
- Many choices out there
- Some are easier to set up than others
- Some are free, some have a subscription cost.
- No one size fits all solution unfortunately.
- Here are a few...



### Device Control – Personal Devices

- Multiple ways to control devices
- Not every tool may be suitable for your family
- Depends on the devices you use and how you use them



- Best Solution for Android based devices
- Also works with iOS devices but doesn't have the same level of control on iOS
- Uses a Parent App installed on the parents device, and a child app on the childrens device.
- You can remotely control their device from yours.
- Can't block websites completely on the device...
- Uses google's filtering tech to block bad search terms/youtube videos, and mature content on chrome.
- Can monitor location.

### • Best Solution for Apple Devices

- Only works with Apple(iOS) devices
- Simple setup on the childs device with a passcode, no software setup needed.
- Best for setting limits on usage.
- Can block websites apple deem unsuitable, by age group.
- Can't fully track a childrens location unless they share it with you.
- No monitoring ability.

### ScreenTime iOS





- This will control Windows devices, xbox's, and some limited functionality on android.
- Best option for windows and Android users.
- Will work with Windows 10+, Xbox One or newer.
- Screen time functionality works on Windows, Xbox and Android.
- Track Websites, and block using content filters.
- Control spending on their xbox/microsoft account.
- Uses google's filtering tech to block bad search terms/youtube videos, and mature content on chrome.
- Only filters content on Edge browser.
- Can monitor location, if you have a personal Office 365 subscription


### **Consoles**

### ( ) Childnet Family Agreement

A great way to start positive family conversations around online safety, and to agree clear expectations and boundaries.

Start by discussing the questions that are most relevant to your family.

### (D) Getting started

- What do we enjoy doing online?
- · What apps, games and websites do we use the most?
- Do we already have any rules about use of tech we want to include in our family agreement?

### (L) Managing time online

- How does it feel when we use tech for too long?
- How do we know when our screen use is interfering with family life?
- What can we do to help avoid overusing tech?

- What should we check before posting images and videos online?
- · Do we know how to use privacy settings and what makes a strong password?
- How can we use features like livestreaming and disappearing content safely?

### Online content

- · How do we decide which websites, apps, games and devices are okay for us to use?
- · What can we do if we see something online which seems unreliable or untrustworthy?
- How can we stop ourselves accidentally spending money in a game or app?

### Communicating online

- Who can we talk, chat or play games with online? Just family? Friends? Anyone?
- · How can we keep ourselves safe if we are communicating with people who we only know online?
- · How can we look after our friends when we are online?

### If things go wrong

- · What can we do if we feel uncomfortable or upset by anything we see or hear online?
- · What should we do if someone we only know online asks us for photos, a video call, to meet up or to share personal information?
- Do we know how to find the report and block buttons on the websites, apps and games we use?

### To finish...

- How could parental controls help our family?
- · What should happen if one of us breaks the family agreement?
- When should we review our family agreement?

### Online safety in the curriculum

Dedicated focus at the start of each year in Key Stage 3

- Year 8 Cyberbullying how to identify, deal with and prevent it
- Year 9 Network threats and threat prevention

# Arbor – Is a data management area for staff, students and parents

- For students Arbor allows you to:
  - See your Timetable
  - See your Attendance




