ACHIEVEMENT AND PROGRESSION

Be it ensuring high levels of academic attainment or providing a broad range of experiences, everything we do at Prince Henry's is geared towards giving our sixth form students the qualifications and skills to be successful in an increasingly competitive future. The use of personalised, challenging academic targets encourages students to maximise their attainment, while effective support systems couple with high teaching standards to help all students achieve the best that they can.

The majority of our students progress to Higher Education and benefit from tailored support programmes, including preparation for applications to Oxford and Cambridge as well as Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science. Each year some of our students achieve at the highest level to take up such coveted places In addition, students of all ability levels go on to study in a wide range of other Higher Education Institutions, with the vast majority of all applicants securing their first choice university place.

We are also very proud of our ability to help our students prepare for the world of work. These employability skills, which our sixth form students learn through the opportunities they enjoy, stand them in great stead when they start work – whether securing an apprenticeship or starting a job straight from school or after university.

LEADERSHIP, ENRICHMENT AND SPORT

At Prince Henry's, we recognise that young people need to develop their leadership, confidence and adaptability in order to thrive in our rapidly changing society. To this end, we offer our sixth form students an extremely wide range of opportunities to foster these skills. Some students choose to get involved with the Senior Student Leadership Team and Student Council, while others join our Debating Team, Duke of Edinburgh programme or one of the many student-led initiatives such as the Global Justice Group or Peer Mentoring Team.

Our bespoke sixth form Enrichment Curriculum gives students the chance to develop the key skills needed for university and wider life through a varied programme of courses and activities. The most popular single course is the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) - an AS level equivalent qualification highly valued by the top universities but also very useful for students wanting to follow alternative career routes such as internships and degree level apprenticeships. Another popular option is volunteering within the local community. With one of the widest ranges of enrichment activities available locally, Prince Henry's students can gain an academic edge as well as accessing a fully rounded education.

In addition to the standard enrichment and extra-curricular options, the Excellence in Sport and Education Programme (ESEP) allows talented athletes the flexibility to integrate specialist training in their chosen sport alongside their A-levels, with a mentor and personalised timetable to support their endeavours.
