Imago Dei

Christians believe that they were created in the image (essence and likeness) of God. This means that humans **reflect** many of the **characteristics of God**, for example humans are creative and loving, just like God is also creative and loving.



Original Sin

Christians believe they used their **free will** to do so and this was the **original sin**; it is this event, known as 'The Fall' that allowed pain and suffering to enter the world.
