Key Stage 3 News

It will be a busy final half term for students in Years 7 and 8, whose end of year assessments in all subjects began this week and will continue until 9th June. Year 12 HE and Careers Preparation

Year 12 students will start their programme of preparation for

Higher Education applications and career planning next half term, including the HE Preparation Day on **Thursday 15th June**, when the main university application process will begin. It is vital that students attend this day to receive key information about UCAS and apprenticeship application procedures. In the afternoon, students will visit Leeds Beckett University to attend the UCAS Discovery Exhibition where they will find out more about university courses and apprenticeship pathways. Students will shortly receive an email about how to register for the exhibition.

Nearly all Year 12 students have now secured work experience placements, which is great news. Well done, Year 12.

On **Monday 17th July 2023**, Year 12 students will have their 'Progression and Future Planning Day'. Most students may choose to take home study on this day to spend time reflecting on their work experience and to work on university or career research and applications. For students where there is concern over their progression onto Year 13 courses following Year 12 exams and Progress Report 3, meetings will be arranged on this day with the Sixth Form team to discuss options. A letter giving further details about this day will be issued after the half-term holiday.

External examinations

GCSE and A level exams are now underway. Students have so far had a really positive approach to these and are to be commended. All students received a copy of the exam expectations and their personal exam timetable earlier this year. They have also attended assemblies outlining key messages and reassuring them of the appropriate

approach to take should things not go to plan. Year 11 students begin their revision leave this Thursday and from that point need only attend school for exams and, should they wish, scheduled masterclasses.

If your child is taking external examinations this year, please reiterate the following key points, which will ensure that exams continue to run smoothly. Students must:

- ◆ Arrive for morning exams by 8.45am and for afternoon exams by 1.00pm.
- ♦ Sign in/out at reception if they remain on site at any other time beyond published exam or masterclass timeslots.
- Not bring bags into the exam venue.
- Not bring any electronic devices (e.g. phones, tablets, fitness trackers, watches) into the exam venue. If a student is spotted with such a device on their person (even if it is switched off), we have a duty to report this to the exam board. This is likely to lead to the student having their paper cancelled and not achieving a grade in that subject.

Students will be able to collect AS/A Level results from 8.30am on Thursday 17th August 2023, and GCSE results from 10.00am on Thursday 24th August 2023. Collecting their results in person means that students will be able to seek support with next steps, if required. This year all students will also have their results emailed to their school email account on the afternoon of results days. As a reminder, a copy of the exams booklet, which answers most exam-related queries, can be found on the school website here.

Feet First - Safe and Sustainable Travel to School

Our student **Active Travel Ambassadors** have been running a project to discover what are the biggest barriers to travelling to school sustainably - and safely.

Feet First Drop Off Points

If you must use a car to travel to school, avoid the queue over the bridge and congestion at the school gate by dropping off your child elsewhere in Otley, leaving them to walk the last 5 or 10 minutes to school. Our Active Travel Ambassadors have arranged with Leeds City Council and Wharfedale Hospital that students can be dropped off and picked up from the North Parade Car Park, the Beech Hill Car Park (now) and, for those on the north of river, the Wharfedale Hospital Car Park (from September) - with no need to pay for the short times that parents/carers will spend in these car parks. These can also be used at school pick up.
