

Do's and Don'ts

Do -

research your options visit universities and ask questions of staff and students listen to advice - but then make your own mind up! Remember that universities need students

Don't -

Worry too much about 'getting it right' Over-analyse your options

Personal statements

Universities are looking for candidates who:

- understand the course(s) they are applying for
- are really enthusiastic about the course
- are aware of the skills they will need (and are developing them)
- have a life outside school!

Costs to Students in Higher Education

- Tuition fees
- Living Costs

Tuition Fees

- Maximum for 2018 £9250 pa
- Students apply for a Student Loan for Fees which they will begin to repay after leaving university (the following April) and when they are earning over £25000
- Fees are paid directly to the university by the Student Loans Company (SLC)

Students eligible for full amount of maintenance loan are likely to be able to apply for bursaries from their university, particularly if the tuition fees charged are over £6000.

More than 50% of full time students also work part-time, with average earnings of £4,500 (2016/17 figure)

Repayments - Worked example

You pay 9% of your income over the threshold. For example, if you're paid monthly and earn £2,250 before tax you'll repay 9% of the difference between what you earn and what the threshold is:



£2,250 - £1,750 = £500 9% of £500 = £45

So your student loan repayment would be £45 in that month.




