## **Distance Learning – Update**

Teachers are working very hard to support our students' learning during this period of school closure.

## **Firefly Tasks:**

On Monday we amended the instructions and guidance given to teachers and we hope that this will improve the experience for our students. However, it is important to note that it is impossible for teachers to differentiate the amount of learning tasks set to suit individual student needs. We believe that the amount set will be suitable for most of our students, but it may be that:

- Some students find that they are struggling to complete all the tasks set. If this is the case for your son or daughter, please check that they are following the guidance given to students (copy attached) and encourage them not to worry, even if they are unable to complete a task to the standard that they would like by the deadline given. This is acceptable as long as they are spending the necessary time (approximately 2 to 3 hours each day) and are trying their very best.
- Some students find that they easily complete all the tasks set and would benefit from further learning. If this is the case for your son or daughter, please encourage them to access the wealth of other subject specific information available to enhance their learning, which can be found on the library pages of Firefly and the school website (please see the "Our School > Curriculum > Online Resources" tab. Additional information will be added over the coming weeks), as well as BBC Bitesize and similar learning resources available on the internet.
- Some students find that the school closure provides an opportunity to avoid learning. Therefore
  it is important for parents to monitor their child's engagement in learning on a regular basis,
  providing appropriate challenge and support where needed. Our monitoring will indicate if a
  student is <u>regularly</u> and <u>frequently</u> not engaging with their learning tasks. If this is the case for
  your son or daughter, the Year Manager will alert you to this fact so that additional support can
  be offered to improve the situation.
- Some SEND students find that the significant change to their routines means that they struggle
  to complete or even start tasks. If this is the case for your son or daughter, please use your
  own knowledge of your child to judge the right amount of expectation to have of them. Do not
  worry if they are unable to fully complete tasks set.

In all cases it is a balance between students' learning and progress and students' good mental health and well-being.

## **Online Safety**

Your son or daughter will be spending a lot more time online during this period of school closure and social distancing measures. The Department for Education (DfE) has provided information for parents and carers, which includes a section on keeping children safe online. It provides links to online resources that will help support parents and carers in keeping their children safe online.
