# <u>Elements of Music</u> – some general things to make sure you know/understand/can identify...

N.B. This is not a comprehensive list...you should also refer to the key vocab guide on Showbie and notes in your folders!

HINT If you understand the element of music in the question (in bold) you'll probably get the answer right!

**Tonality:** Major / minor, modulations (e.g. to dominant, subdominant, relative major/minor), atonal

**Harmony:** Common chord progressions (e.g. 12-bar blues), chords used (e.g. primary chords, major, minor, discords, 7<sup>th</sup> chords), cadences, pedal notes, drone, dissonance / consonance

**Texture:** monophonic, homophonic, polyphonic, octaves, a cappella, melody and accompaniment, contrapuntal

**Melody:** stepwise (conjunct) / leaps (disjunct), sequence, repetition, melisma, ornaments, blue notes, chromatic, ascending/descending, repeated notes, glissando/slides, large/narrow range, memorable/catchy, scalic, triadic, balanced phrases,

**Rhythm:** syncopation, off-beat, back-beat, skank, hemiola, dotted rhythms, repeated rhythms, identifying note length e.g. crotchets, quavers, semiquavers.

Metre: identifying time signatures (e.g. 2/4, 3/4 4/4, 6/8 etc.)

**Tempo:** Largo, Andante, Moderato, Allegro, Presto, etc. Changes to tempo – accelerando, rallentando, tempo rubato

**Sonority:** identifying particular instruments + voices, instrumental techniques (e.g. arco, pizz, use of mutes, etc.)

Structure / form: e.g. AB, ABA, 12-bar blues, AAB lyrics, into – verse – chorus, strophic,

**Dynamics:** piano, forte, mf, crescendo, diminuendo, etc.

Articulation: staccato, legato, accents, slurs, detached notes, etc.

**Melodic dictation** – listen to if the notes are the same, higher or lower. Do they move by steps or are there small leaps?
