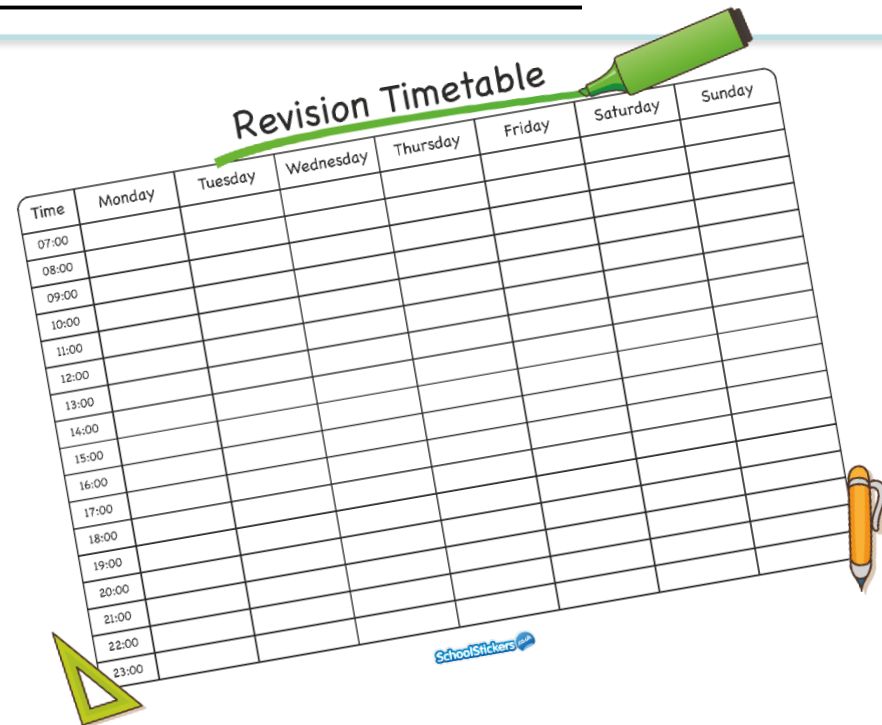
- Improve your own understanding of their challenges

- Motivating

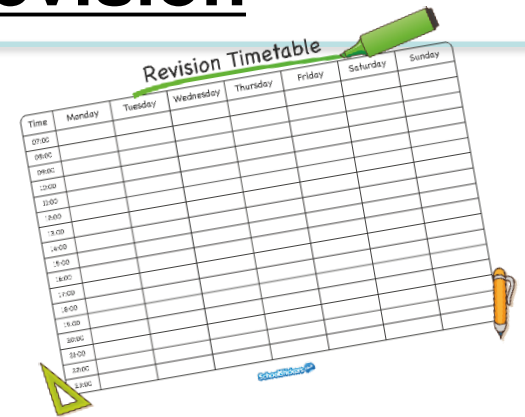


Parental Engagement with Revision

Timetabling

Top tips...

- Pen, paper, rules, colour code
- List all subjects, then units, then topics
- Mix subjects up in a day
- Decide which times they work best, timetable tasks that require most concentration then
- Start day off with something they can accomplish, making the next slot more challenging
- Regular breaks, but not rigid!
- Cross things off
- Revisit topics regularly
- Don't neglect the easier stuff!

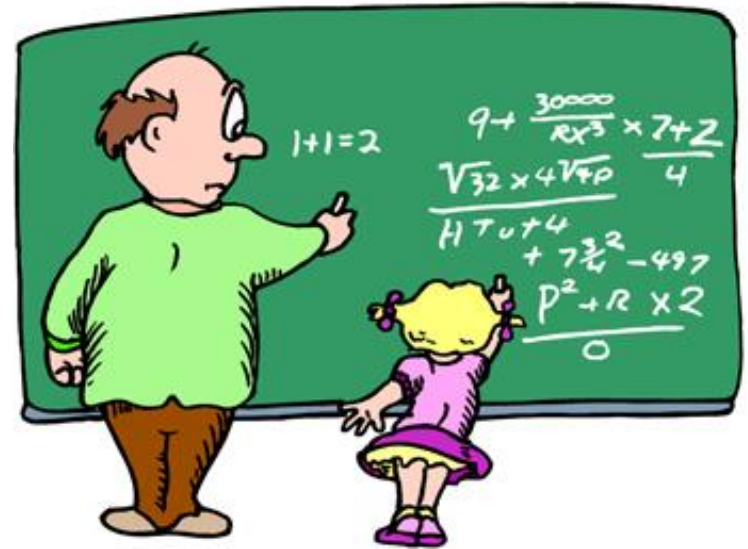


Parental Engagement with Revision

- Reinforces learning
- Deepens understanding
- Highlights areas for development
- Active
- Reinforce their own way of learning by instructing others
- Allows for questioning to challenge understanding

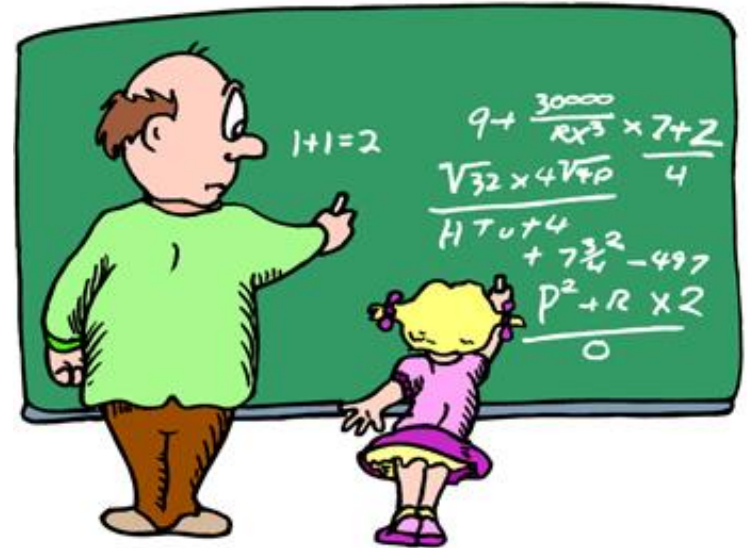


Parental Engagement with Revision

The practicalities...

- Factor “lessons” into revision timetable
- Small focus for “lessons”
- Ask questions which are suitably challenging

- Reinforces learning
- Reinforces understanding of exam style questions
- Competitive
